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## Faith that does Justice

At Stonyhurst this year, we are rolling out a new and bespoke service learning programme whose principles are derived from Ignatian pedagogy. Service learning can be defined as: 'a teaching and learning strategy which applies classroom learning through meaningful service to the community.'

All students, from Early Years (Nursery) to Grammar (Year 10) will engage in service learning. The programme follows the same format for every year group, which is as follows: in Term I, students are encouraged to be discerning as links to their year group service learning focus are embedded in lessons to ensure students are attentively exploring ideas. In Term 2, students are encouraged to be curious as they engage in a trip or visit which links service learning to the wider community and inspires them to turn their learning into compassionate action. They will then take part in guided reflection to consider what they learned from their trip or visit and how this inspires them. In Term 3, students are encouraged to be intentional and prophetic by planning and accomplishing a service learning action in collaboration with their year group. The wider school community will then be invited to celebrate what students have achieved.
